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Uniform and Equipment

The ENL UTC dress code forms an important part of creating a modern, successful setting that strikes a balance between individual choice and the need to maintain high-standards. Alongside this, having the right equipment ensures a professional and responsible approach to learning.

Additional Points to Note

- Words and diagrams on clothing should not be visible unless a company logo
- If a jumper is worn underneath a suit, it must be plain and feature no logos, drawings or writing
- Attire should be professional and suitable for a workplace, no offensive language or diagrams
- Outer coats, scarves, gloves, hats and body warmers should not be worn inside the building
- No jewellery or facial piercings are permitted, other than a watch, 1 necklace and 1 pair of plain studs
- Make up should be subtle and no acrylic nails can be worn

Professional Standards

At the ENL UTC, we are professional, responsible and loyal.

Positive Learning Habits

- The Pastoral team will always seek to support students, but in the event of repeated poor behaviour choices, further consequences may be applied.

Staff members are encouraged to send postcards home in lessons and make regular contact with home via phone calls and emails. Students can be nominated for special rewards.

You should always aim to achieve 100% attendance every year, the same as in industry. If you are absent from school, the ENL UTC main reception must be contacted at the start of each day of absence, so the register can be marked accordingly. If the absence is longer than three days or no contact has been made, a home visit may be undertaken by your head of year.

For any medical appointments, you will need to take appointment cards and/or letters to your head of year prior to the appointment date, whilst remembering to sign in and out at Main Reception when leaving or returning from an appointment. It is advised that, where possible, any appointments are made out of school hours.

The School Canteen

The canteen is open to serve food and refreshments at the following times:
